

Nationalisation of non-Govt primary school teachers' job demanded

Bangladesh Non-government Primary School Teachers' Association took a bid to lay siege on the Prime Minister's office on Saturday, wearing shroud demanding nationalisation of non-government primary schools and jobs of the teachers.

The brought out a procession from the Muktangan in the city but could not proceed much as the police obstructed them.

Earlier, at a rally at the Muktangan the teachers' leaders said the ruling BNP in its election manifesto had committed to nationalise the jobs of non-government primary school teacher but the pledge is yet to be implemented even after four years in power.

Mohammad Shamsul Alam, president of the Non-government primary school teachers association said the association would

not leave streets until their demand is fulfilled.
