# CU likely to sue Faizee

CHITTAGONG, Mar 4:- Chittagong University (CU) is likely to sue justice Faisal Mahmud Faizee and many others who procured graduation and post graduation certificates and transcripts of the

university by fraudulence.

Officials at the university's controller of examinations said that they would soon send the findings of the inquiry committee on certificate fraud and the reso-

lutions of the syndicate to the Anti Corruption Commission (ACC) for necessary legal actions.

The CU inquiry committee is learnt to have detected more than 2388 cases of certificate fraud,

transcript tempering and other forms of deception mainly took place in slightly less than a decade from 1983 to 1992.

sity Dr. M Badiul Alam in an interview with The Bangladesh Observer this afternoon at his office admitted that the inquiry team had worked on 2388 cases of specific complaints and suspicions that came to surface time to time.

He claimed that the university would soon publish the list of the certificate frauds by a gazette notification and ask them to return the copies of the certificates and transcripts. He strongly recommended trial and exemplary punishment to those involved in certificate forgery.

"The university administration is now working hard to figure out a relatively better and foolproof method of operation at the transcript and certificate department apart from the exam control and answer-script evaluation units," the VC said.

It could not, however, be known immediately how many public figures were among the certificate frauds. But some of the university officials feared that the fraud list might carry the names of top brasses both in the private and public sectors.

"I feel like getting fainted when I think about the humiliation and social disgrace awaiting the top brasses," a senior faculty of the university said.

Many at the university and the outside as well welcomed the syndicate resolutions on the certificate frauds. It is commonly believed that the uncompromising step taken against the culprits will help unearth of many other irregularities done deliberately at the CU by the vested quarters.
