Non-govt edn instt need not get govt clearance for teacher-employee appointment

Country's non-government educational institutions, from now, will not have to take government clearance to appoint teachers and employees to vacant posts, reports UNB.

A government notification Tuesday said: "From now on, the educational institutions would have to follow the Manpower Structure Act 1995 in appointing teachers and employees."

Leading teachers said the process of appointment became very complex and time-consuming due to the rule for collecting clearance from the government. They welcomed the new decision.

"I appreciate the decision. We

traditionally followed the 1995 Act, but the caretaker government ordered the institutions to take clearance from the DG office of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Department for any appointment," said Principal of Abu Dhar Giffari College Nurunabi Siddiqui.

The 1995 law provides that concerned authorities of the institutions should give appointments as per subject-wise set requirements.
