



## Campus violence claims 13 lives of students in BAU since 1972

MYMENSINGH, Jan 4:—A total of 13 students have lost their lives and more than 200 students injured in campus violence at Bangladesh Agricultural University since 1972 to 2001.

The first clash took place in the university in 1972 after the independence. The clash ensued between teachers-employees and students of the university. One Ranjit a student of the university was killed in the clash.

Three leaders of BAUCSU—Showkat, Wali and Mohasin and Convenor of BAU unit of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal ATM Khalid were killed in the post election violence in 1980.

Rezaur Rahman Sabuj, an worker of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal and a student of the second

year of Animal Husbandry faculty was killed in a gun battle between two factions of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal on January 24, 1993.

A clash was held between the employees and students of the university took place in 1994. 'Gazi' a son of an employee and student of the university was killed in gun battle.

Four activists of Islami Chhatra Shibir were killed in the clashes on December 15 and 16 in 1995. They are identified as Alauddin, Showkat Hossain Talukdar, Manjurul Kabir and Hasan Jahir Oliur.

Ranjit and Kamal, two students of the university were gunned down by the terrorists on November 9, 1996.
