CU teachers to boycott one afternoon class

CHITTAGONG, Aug. 10.—The General Teachers Parishad today took a decision to refrain from taking one afternoon class for indefinite period to press home for freeing of Chittagong University campus from the grip of terrorists.

This section of general teachers who are loyal to the present Vice-Chancellor Prof. Alamgir Mohammad Shirajuddin also decided to stay away from participation in any kind of administrative work of the University for the next one week.

The General Teachers Parishad took these decisions at a meeting held at the University Arts Faculty today with Dr. Fasiul Alam of Management Department in the chair. Among the speakers at the meeting were Prof. Ali Emdad Khan, Prof. Abdul Mannan, Prof. Hujjat Ali Pramanik, Dr. Momtazuddin Patwari and Dr. Abdul Waseh.

The Parishad members pledged to continue their movement till the root out of what they called terrorists from the University of Chittagong. They also demanded of the Gov-

ernment to flush out terrorists from the all educational institutions including Chittagong University.

The General Teachers Parishad also lamented that the Education Minister Dr. Badruddoza gave the statement on Chittagong University at the Parliament not "basing on facts". They deplored the role of government in matter of Chittagong University.

The provosts of student halls also held a meeting on Friday. The meeting was presided over by Suhrawardy Hall Provost Dr. Enamul Hoq. The meeting decided not to attend any administrative work of existing six halls till next Thursday in protest against siege of the Vice-Chancellor at his residence by the Shibir activists.

Meanwhile, the Shibir backed Sangrami Chhatra Oikya continued its programme of gherao of Vice-Chancellor at his residence for the tenth consecutive day today. The Shibir activists also held rally and took out processions today demanding the resignation of the Vice-Chancellor and implementation of judicial enquiry commission report.
