Aggrieved JCD leaders, activists bring out coffin procession' on DU campus

Aggrieved leaders and activists of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) on Wednesday brought out a 'coffin procession' on the Dhaka University (DU) campus protesting the expulsion of four leaders of DU unit of JCD.

Rejecting the newly formed JCD central committee, they vowed that they would continue their protests against the new leadership.

Earlier, top leaders of the newly formed central committee dissolved three units including DU unit and expelled four leaders from the organisation on Monday last for their protests against the central committee. The expelled leaders are JCD-DU unit general secretary Saiful Islam Firoz, senior vice-president Mamun-or-Rashid, organising secretary Sadiul Islam Nirob, and joint-secretary Akram Hossain.

Saiful Islam Firoz and Mamun-or-Rashid condemned the expulsion decision saying that such move a conspiracy against JCD.

Firoz told The Bangladesh Observer that those who organised the issuance of our expulsion orders were not actively involved in any programs of the party whenever it faced tough challenges. The field-level JCD activists had always stood by the party when it faced any crisis in the past, he further said.

Terming the expulsion order as undemocratic and conspiratorial, he said such decision would halt the JCD politics and tarnish its image as well.

Several hundred agitated JCD leaders and activists had protested on the DU campus from July 1 last when the names of the 101 members of the new central committee were announced.
