

Teachers urged to patronise students

President Abdur Rahman Biswas on Monday called upon the educated section and experts to identify the problems, faced by the country and resolve them permanently, reports BSS.

He said blaming others was in fact denying one's own responsibility which could hardly bear any fruitful result.

The President was exchanging views with a 12-member delegation of Bangladesh Principals Council, led by its Chairman Principal Mahmud Mokarram Hossain, when they called on him at his residence on Monday morning.

President Biswas said a society cannot always submit to its problems and must keep its head high with the active cooperation of the intelligentsia.

Referring the terrorism in the campus, he said our efforts should also be given in curbing violence in educational institutions.

President Biswas said terrorists are minority in number and for them the

common students and brilliant boys cannot spoil their future. He urged the teachers to patronise the meritorious students.

Emphasising the need for continuation of a democratic government in the country, he said this was imperative for keeping the development unhindered.

Recalling the memory of his teachers including poet Jibandanda Das and Dr. Dani, the President said the teachers should discharge their due responsibility to build their own students. He urged them to support in spreading female education so that the woman folk could be inspired to participate in the national development.

The teachers have also placed before him some of their problems and the President assured them that they would be looked into.
