leaders of different student organisations.

The meeting mainly discussed the February 21 celebrations and the overall campus situation. The VC said the campus situation is now much better than any time before.

He thanked the student organisations for the current peaceful situation on the campus.

Prof Azad also sought cooperation from all the student bodies in maintaining the peaceful and congenial atmosphere and regaining the past glory of the university by stamping out terrorism from the campus for good.

The meeting decided that the student organisation would not paste any poster or write on the university walls and buildings as a cleanliness drive was going on to observe February 21, the anniversary of the histroy Language Movement. The restriction will remain in force till February 21.

The decision was taken at the proposal of the VC, who also proposed that billboards could be erected at major points of the campus as an alternative arrangement for postering and wall-writing.

Leaders of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) at the meeting alleged that some of their activists cannot live in their dormitories due to frequent threats from their opponents. The VC assured them of personally looking into the matter.

Leaders of Bangladesh Chhatra Union placed their demand for installing card phone booths on the campus for the university students. The Vice-Chancellor also assured them of taking necessary step toward realising the demand.

Among others, DUCSU General Secretary Khairul Kabir Khokon, JCD leaders Habibunnabi Sohel, Mosharraf Hossain and Monir Hossain, Chhatra League (S-P) leaders Mahbubul Huq Shakil and Sazzad Hossain were present.
