



School headmaster held on cheating charge

FARIDPUR, July 16.—Mr. Abdur Razzak (42), Headmaster of Baburchar Primary (Govt.) School in Sadarpur thana was arrested on July 3 on charge of cheating eight persons, according to police source.

Abdur Razzak allegedly took over Taka two lakhs from eight persons of the locality on an assurance of sending them to Malaysia for employment in suitable jobs. He delayed the matter of sending them to Malaysia for months together, on different excuses.

At this, suspicion arose in the minds of the persons who had given him money in good faith. When they put pressure on him for refunding the money, Abdur Razzak went into hiding. A case was lodged against Abdur Razzak who surrendered to Kotwali thana and prayed for a bail. But police sent him to the Faridpur jail having rejected his bail prayer.

No admission in HSC classes
