# Dacca Municipal Corpn to run city pry schools

Mr. Abul Hasrat, Mayor, Dacca Municipal Corporation, said on Friday that the responsibility for running the primary schools of the city will be returned to Municipal Corporation Management in March this year.

Addressing a reception accorded to him by the Dhanmandi Tax-payers Association he said that the Municipal Corporation would make all possible efforts to raise the standard of education in those schools.

Referring to the problems faced by the city dwellers Mr. Hasrat said that the Corporation had undertaken a Taka 10 crore programme for developing the streets which will be completed within three years.

He said that the United Nations Environment Programme had assured a grant of Taka 20 crore for ensuring cleanliness in the city. He said that the fund will be spent to provide the city with 100 playgrounds and parks. Besides, the kutcha toilets of the city will be developed, he said.
