

Anomalies in govt college teachers' rule to be removed

1400 lecturers to be appointed soon: Sircar

Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar on Tuesday called upon the government college teachers to put in their sincere efforts for improving the standard of the education of the country, reports BSS.

He said, we are determined to restore academic atmosphere on the campus through eradicating violence and session jam.

The Education Minister was addressing as the chief guest the conference of Bangladesh Government College Lecturer and Professor Associations held at the Engineers Institute in Dhaka, an official handout said.

Presided over by President of the associations Prof Kamal Ataur Rahman, the conference was addressed by State Minister for Establishment Barrister Aminul Hoq, former Chairman of Bangladesh Public Service Commission Prof Yeazuddin Ahmed and General Secretaries of the lecturer's and professor's associations Mrs Ismat Ara Begum and Prof Mamtaz Begum respectively.

The Education Minister said the session jam would be eradicated and academic discipline would be restored soon at degree level as proper steps were being taken by the National University. The government will recruit about 1400 lecturers to fill up the vacant posts in the government colleges, he added.
