A formal agreement has been signed between the Pirojpur Science and Technology University authorities and the selected consulting firm for the preparation of an integrated feasibility study, master plan and related development project plan to place the overall development activities of PSTU.

Project director Muhammad Mahbus Sobhan signed the agreement on behalf of the university at a signing ceremony at the temporary office of the university at Kazipara in Dhaka on Saturday.

A joint venture firm comprising Sarm Associates, Triangle Consultants, Synthesis Architects and CEGIS was finally selected as the consultant following the Quality and Cost Based Selection Method (QCBS).

The agreement was also signed by Engineer Mia Mohammad Qayum (Serm Associates), Architect Shakur Majid (Triangle Consultants), Architect Patrick D. Rosario (Synthesis Architects) and a representative of CEGIS on behalf of the consulting joint venture.

PSTU vice-chancellor Professor Md Shahidul Islam, deputy director (finance and accounts) Md Arafat Hossain, executive director of Serm Associates Engineer Akhtaruzzaman and senior officials of the university and related institutions were present.

As per the agreement, the consulting firm will prepare and submit a modern and integrated master plan, detailed feasibility study report and development project plan for the newly established university on approximately 75 acres of land located in Kadamtala and Brahmanakathi mouzas of Pirojpur Municipality within the next four months.

The stakeholders expressed their hope that through the implementation of this initiative, new horizons will be opened for the expansion of higher education in the southern part of the country, development of research and innovation-based infrastructure and the establishment of an environmentally friendly and sustainable university campus.
